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LUANG PRABANG TO VANG VIENG





uang Prabang is a beautiful cultural city. This charming town is located in north central Laos. Luang Prabang is an outstanding example of the fusion of traditional architecture and Lao urban structures with those built by the European colonial. Visitors to Luang Prabang are charmed by the friendly atmosphere of this small

town. The town itself offers several unique insights into the history of the region, through excellently preserved Buddhist temples, museum and a variety of Lao, Tai-Lue, Burmese, Chinese and Tai architecture at the Night Market. Luang Prabang sells a large variety of traditional goods.

The town is famous for its unique textiles and beautiful mulberry paper. Famous foods in Luang Prabang are "Aur Lam" (a thick stew made with the forsted herb), "Sakhan", (meat and eggplants), "Jaew Bong", (a sauce made with hot

chilies and buffalo skin) and "Khai Pan" (dried river weed lightly fried with sesame seeds and garlic).

LEARNING THE TRADITIONAL THROUGH BUDDHIST TEMPLES

The wonderful thing about Luang Prabang is its scale: there's plenty to see, but a few morning strolls can take most of it in. The earlier the better in fact, since most folk roll out of bed at 6am to offer alms to the resident monks (in a ceremony known as takbat). Luang Prabang has no shortage of either monasteries or wats and for many visitors this is the source of its charm.

Wat Xiang Thong is the grandest. Located near the tip of the northern peninsular, it was built for the royal family in the 16th century and is a prime example of the area's temple architecture. Look out for the large tree of life mosaic on the rear wall. The conical Phou Si wat at the top of the town's central mound provides a great lookout for sunset, while the longboats stored at Wat Saen give you a sampler of the town's boat festival in the autumn.



You'll not be short of options when it comes to tour providers. As well as the many lining Xiang Thong, even the tuk tuk drivers will have printed rates for trips.

Look at half-day tours to the lovely limestone Kuang Si and Tad Se waterfalls – good for a splash and a picnic – and the caves at Pak Ou, which offer a good excuse for a boat trip. Chock full of old Buddha statues the caves are a sombre sight. Other adventures can of course be taken farther afield. Explore hidden rivers in kayaks, ride elephants through the forest, or trek through the hills and lay your hat at Hmong and Khmu village home-stays along the way. Great insights are on offer on some educational trips that make considerable effort to impart local knowledge beyond the neat 'tourist' package.





LUANG PRABANG NIGHT MARKET

The Evening Market is a nightly event that takes place between 17:00 and 23:00 beginning at Wat Mai and running along Sisavangvong Road to the town centre. The street is closed off to vehicles. Apart from the market vendors. shop-houses and hotels lining both sides of the road are also open for business. The range of products include handmade souvenirs, Lao coffee beans, homemade whiskeys, books, all the way to street-side noodle stalls tucked away in a small lane and hotel sidewalk cafés serving drinks and, of course, Beer Lao. For a serious meal, though, head over to the end of the market (where Sisavangvong Road meets Settathilat Road) and you will find the Night Food Market as well as food vendors down the narrow lane just next to it. Note that the market can get very crowded after 20:00.

To sip a cup of aromatic coffee or grab a bite and admire the spectacular view, this cafe is a great choice.

UMPOUT TO VANG VIENG

Vang Vieng for many travelers is simply a piece of heaven on earth. Surrounded by scenic landscape ranging from mountains to rivers and limestone cliffs to rice fields, this small and scenic town offers a long list of interesting attractions. The Nam Song River is where you will witness the famous tubing – and young travellers sitting in large inner tubes floating downriver is a common sight in Vang Vieng. Actually it has become a large part of the reason why many young people come here in the first place. The well-known Tham Poukham Cave features the 'Blue Lagoon', a nice spot to swim and swing lazily on a rope, while Tham Norn is among one of the biggest caves in Vang Vieng. If time allows, make a stop at the local market to catch a gimpse of everyday life in a typical Lao rural area.

VANG VIENG'S SECRET BLUE LAGOON

It was extremely satisfying to come down from the climb and jump, literally, into the water. The Blue Lagoon is a small turquoise blue spot created by mountain streams. It is full of small fish but they will not bother you at all. The lagoon can get very deep at certain points and there are several places you can climb a tree and jump right into the water. They also have a rope swing that is really fun to use. There are several facilities available for visitors to the lagoon. If you get hungry, they have restaurants overlooking. There is a water slide you can use (one time payment for unlimited use). For those who are not confident swimmers, there are also life jackets for rent.


PLACE MASSENA

However, the reward you would get from climbing the staircase won't be just the scenery at the top, but the spectacular artificial waterfall and panoramic views of Nice along the way as well.





THE COLOR OF THE EASTERN SEA

Koh Kood may be one of the biggest islands in Thailand, after Phuket, Koh Chang and Koh Samui, but it has managed to keep its pristine natural assets unspoiled. The island is a part of Trat province, and its serenity and abundance have attracted divers and travelers across the globe, earning Koh Kood the reputation of the "Andaman of the Eastern" Sea".





LANDMARKS OF KOOD ISLAND

AO KLONG YAI KEE

A breathtaking bay with a pristine 300 meters white sand beach, Ao Klong Yai Kee allows visitors to enjoy the sand and the sun right by lush tropical forest. In addition to beautiful beach and crystal-clear water, the bay is a spectacular spot to watch a romantic sunset, and the nearby waterfall transport you from the sea setting to a mountain setting within a few minutes hike.

ΑΟ ΤΑΡΑΟ

Rustic wooden pier stretches out into the shallow sea, inviting you to walk to the far end and be surrounded by marvelous beach and sparkling water. Ao Tapao is close to Ban Klong Hin Dam, Ban Klong Mard, and connected to Ao Klong Jao via a wooden bridge, so it's easy to find variety of restaurants and shops nearby.



Getting there

From Bangkok, travel on Bangkok-Chonburi Motorway. Turn left at Ban Bueng – Klaeng Road intersection, and travel towards Chantaburi and Trat. At Trat, make your way to Laem Ngob Pier to catch a ferry to Koh Kood. The trip takes approximately 4 hours 15 minutes (315 km.) and overnight carpark is available at the pier for 50 Baht per night.



BAN AO YAI

Fresh seafood is always a must when visiting a seaside destination and Koh Kood is no exception. Ban Ao Yai is a local fisherman village and fresh off the boat seafood is served in variety of ways here. Whether you like them grilled or steamed, fresh seafood is always impressive! After satisfying your belly, take a leisure stroll around the village to experience the traditional fisherman way of life that has been passed on for generations.

AO NOI

Only a few introductions are needed for Ao Noi. As one of the most popular destination on Koh Kood, Ao Noi is known for its powdery beach and astonishing sea views. It's also impossible to miss the iconic pavilion out in the sea at the end of the wooden bridge where hundreds of pictures are taken every day.

BLACK ROCK

Black Rock Pier is simply the beating heart of Koh Kood. Here you will find the largest fisherman community on the island, government agencies, and spiritual centers like Wat Rat Bumrung (Wat Klong Hin Dam), as well as the busiest shopping district.

PHRAO BEACH

Stretches 800 meters along the western coast of Koh Kood, Phrao Beach got its name from the coconut grove that can be seen everywhere on the beach. With shallow water and soft sand, this is one of Koh Kood's best spot to stay and enjoy the beach. Locals also visit the bay frequently to pay respect to the statue of Prince Abhakara of Chumphon, the father of the Royal Thai Navy.



KOH KOOD PARADISE BEACH

Savour flavourful fusion dishes in a cozy modern atmosphere with a splash of traditional Thai accent. The stars of the menu are a range of fresh seafood like Spaghetti seafood green curry, and stirfried calamari with salted egg.

IN TRINIDAD

Trinidad, a small Central Cuban town in Sancti Spíritus province, has over 5 centuries of history hidden under its simple appearance. Registered as the UNESCO's World Heritage in 1988, the town perfectly maintains its cultural charm since Cuba is one of a few countries that ban American products and technology. The way of life here is a reflection of the bygone days when the internet wasn't a part of our life and social media was unheard of. Explore the quiet town on foot, take photos of colonial style buildings, chill out by the sea, and get a ride on the classic 1950's cars. Meeting and talking to the people to learn about local culture and tradition seems like a better idea than learning from the screen. Live a slower life and see happiness at a slower pace.

How To Get There

Getting to Trinidad requires a little more hassle than an ordinary leisure trip. Plan the trip well as multiple airport transits are necessary. The most convenient route takes approximately 35-40 hours from Banakok is from Suvarnabhumi Airport (Bangkok, Thailand) >> Chek Lap Kok Airport (Hong Kong) >> Lester B Pearson Airport (Toronto, Canada) >> Jose Marti - Rancho Boyeros Airport (Havana, Cuba), then catch a bus from La Habana Station to Trinidad.

PLAZA MAYOR (MAIN SQUARE TRINIDAD)

Surrounded by well-preserved historic buildings in the heart of Trinidad, Plaza Mayor is like an outdoor museum to witness the charm of centuries-old colonial architectures in Trinidad.

CHURCH OF THE HOLY TRINITY

Church of the Holy Trinity isn't just a spectacular neo-classic church, but a spiritual center for the people of Trinidad as well. The architectural and cultural landmark was built in 1892 and stands majestically above a hill facing the Bahia de Casilda.

Just a few minutes from the Church of the Holy Trinity, Saint Francis Church also stands uniquely with 42 meters tall bell tower where tourists can climb up to watch the panoramic views of Trinidad. The church also exhibits collections of Fidel Castro and Che Guevara's belongings.

MUSEUM OF THE STRUGGLE AGAINST BANDITS

The name Museum of the Struggle Against Bandits hardly rolls of the tongue as sometimes history is told through the eyes of the victor. The stories of Cuba's struggle against the mighty USA during the cold war between 1959-1965, including the bravery of Fidel Castro and Che Guevara, are heroically displayed at the museum.

-Tip

Fidel Castro and Che Guevara were the two most influential political figures in Cuba during the revolution. The revolution saw US-backed military dictator, Fulgencio Batista, overthrown and his regime cracked down. It's common to see pictures of Fidel and Che everywhere in the country as the saviors of Cuba.



THE MANACA IZNAGA TOWER

Built 180 years ago by a wealthy merchant, Manaca Iznaga, to watch over 30,000 slaves working in his sugar cane plantation. The tower shoots 45 meters above the ground and 28 meters below ground with 184 steps of stairs. The view from the top floor stretch to the horizon, and it's a much serene view without tenthousands slaves in the picture. Before you go out to explore the surrounding area, make sure you refuel with some delicious Cuban treat on the ground floor of the tower.

MUNICIPAL HISTORY MUSEUM (CANTERO PALACE)

ASIA'S REMOTE CITY



PAI, THAILAND

Pai is a charming small town hidden in the misty mountains of Mae Hong Son. Although its traditional natural beauty has been worn down by influxes of tourists as the town becomes widely known due to media and reviews, this dream city continues to be a timelessly charismatic lady that is slowly adjusting herself to the modern day while staying classy in her own traditional way. The old road in the city center remains the beating heart of Pai with cafés and jazz bars inviting tourists from around the globe to come and share their cultures. At the same time, surrounding Pai is the pristine nature that continues to captivate visitors and give Pai its renowned charm, especially during winter.



Things to do

MEMORIAL BRIDGE

Memorial Bridge is the first landmark that welcomes all visitor to Pai. This symbol of the past tells the history of Pai as it was built during the second World War for Japanese troops en route to Myanmar. The original bridge was burnt down by the Japanese and what you now see is actually the old Nawarat Bridge from Chiangmai. The bridge is similar to Kwai River Bridge in Kanchanaburi and it's naturally the landmark where almost all visitors stop by and take a picture so that they can say they have officially arrived in Pai!



CHEDI PHRA THAT MAE YEN

Although Wat Phra That Mae Yen might not look at all iconic or stands out from other northern temples, this temple has been the spiritual center for local Pai residences. The temple is perched on top of a hill so it commands a spectacular scenery of the whole town, but that isn't all the highlight of the temple as it is home to the chapel and 3 meters tall pagoda which houses the giant white Buddha statue known as "Phra Buddha Lokutara Maha Munee."

KHO GU SO BRIDGE

Located in Pembok village, Boon Bridge or Kho Gu So Bridge is another beautiful landmark not to be missed. The bamboo bridge stretches across verdant green rice paddies magically create the perfect natural scenery of people living harmoniously with the nature. Before the bridge was built, it was difficult and dangerous for monks to receive alms each morning, especially during monsoon season, so villagers got together to build Kho Gu So Bridge. Monks in the village can now use the bridge to commute without the risk of slipping in the mud or walking on the rice paddies. The bridge's reputation now goes beyond Pai and thousands of tourists make their way here to experience the charm of beautiful rice paddies and feel the gentle valley breeze of Pai.





Tip

There are many breathtaking sunrise/sunset spots you wouldn't want to miss out on. Our recommendation is to wake up early for magical sunrise scenery at Yoon Lai scenic spot. You'll be surrounded by the sea of fog while watching the sun rising up from the back of the mountain and sipping hot tea.

WALKING STREET

Pai Walking Street used to have only a few local stalls when it first started. It now is one of the most popular destination in Pai with plenty of traditional food and handicrafts. Taste local favourites like Kanom-jean Nam-ngiew and Kao-pook or shop for handmade dresses, jewelries, and bags. Don't forget to get a postcard as a token of your lovely experience in Pai.



Where to Fat

SILHOUETTE BY REVERIE SIAM

Setting itself apart from all fine dining scene in Pai, Silhouette is the first and only place in town to enjoy Italian-style tapas, as well as a range of delectable pasta and Mediterranean menus. The colonial inspired vintage restaurant is cozily located in the famous Reverie Siam Resort, guaranteeing a chic, yet warm atmosphere whether you are just enjoying a great brunch or planning a romantic dinner.
